# Florida Ethnobotany:

Uses of Plants by Early Settlers in Southern Florida Dr. Bradley Bennett, Florida International University

Dr. Bennett is a professor in the Department of Biological



Sciences at FIU. He earned degrees from Bucknell University, Florida Atlantic University, and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and then was a postdoctoral fellow and research associate at the New York Botanical Garden's Institute of Economic Botany. His main research focus is Neotropical ethnobotany and ethnopharmacology. Dr. Bennett and his graduate students work in more than a dozen countries besides the U.S. His book Ethnobotany of the Shuar of Amazonian Ecuador won the 2006

## FIELD TRIP

If the weather is very bad call to confirm (Patty, 305-255-6404). Field trips are for the study of plants and enjoyment of nature by FNPS members and their guests. Collecting is not permitted. **Sunday, March 6, 2016: Everglades National Park cypress dome.** We will walk (or *slog*) to a dome with deep water, large trees and a beautiful array of plants.

- **Bring:** Water, sun protection. A walking stick might be helpful for some. (Bug protection just in case hopefully not needed.) (You might like a change of shoes and pants as well.)
- Wear: Sturdy shoes & long pants that can get muddy and wet.
- Deep water precautions: In the dome it could be knee to thigh deep, and you can fall in. Zip lock bags for electronics advised.
- **Difficulty:** Moderate/difficult. Walking on open prairie no tall sawgrass but pinnacle rock and holes require careful walking. Leg-sucking mud in the dome.
- Late? Try Patty's cell (305-878-5705) but reception is poor in the park. Find us ½ mile west of the Pa-hay-okee turnoff.
- Leader: Dave King, FNPS member and retired park ranger. Dave first came to ENP in 1979 as a seasonal naturalist at Shark Valley, and continued in various locations in ENP, Biscayne NP, Shenandoah NP and others from Minnesota to Alaska before serving as the Florida Bay District Ranger from 1989-2010.
